RECYCLE

Put recyclable items loose (NOT in plastic bags) in the blue container EXCEPT for shredded paper—place that in a paper bag labeled “shredded paper.”

Recycling “Buddy Bags”

Store recyclables in these reusable bags until you’re ready to empty them into the centralized **BLUE RECYCLE CONTAINERS**. Need a Buddy Bag? Contact your Property Manager to arrange for a free delivery from Recology.

PLEASE NO PLASTIC PACKAGING OR FLIMSY PLASTICS!



COMPOST

Put food scraps, food & beverage soiled paper, and yard/landscape materials in the green container. NO glass and plastics (including Bioplastics).

Kitchen Pail



For complexes with compost collection, residents are provided kitchen pails at no charge. Simply use the pail for food scraps and food soiled paper, then empty the contents into the centralized **GREEN COMPOST CONTAINER**. Certified BPI compostable bags are acceptable.

WHAT IF YOUR COMPLEX DOESN'T HAVE A COMPOST PROGRAM?

The above materials go into the landfill container. If you’re interested in starting a compost program, speak with your Property Manager to get in touch with Recology to set up service.



LANDFILL

Put non-recyclable and non-toxic items in the black container.

BAG YOUR WASTE & KEEP CONTAINER LIDS CLOSED!

Please remember to bag your waste and keep lids closed. This will help prevent unwanted birds or critters from getting into your garbage, and reduce the chance of littering the street.

OTHER SERVICE INFORMATION

BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

Two FREE Bulky Item Collections (BIC) are provided per calendar year to multi-family complexes (**not per individual unit**) from **Feb. 1 through Dec. 31**.

BICs **must be scheduled by the Property Manager**, who will coordinate with Recology to schedule collection dates.

BIC PROGRAM MATERIALS:

- **Accepted Items:** household waste, mattresses, furniture, electronic waste, and non-commercial sized appliances, such as refrigerators, freezers, washers, and dryers. *PLEASE NOTE: Electronic Waste and appliances need to be kept separate from regular household waste.*
- **Unaccepted Items:** hazardous waste, dirt, rock, and concrete.

MOVING OUT? WE CAN HELP!

If you are moving out and cannot wait for the standard Bulky Item Collection at your complex, below are some options:

- **Donate** items in good condition that you no longer need. Visit [RethinkWaste.org/ReduceWaste](https://www.RethinkWaste.org/ReduceWaste) to learn more.
- **Drop off** materials at the Shoreway Transfer Station or Public Recycling Center (read more below).
- **Individual bulky item pick-up can be scheduled for a fee.** Contact Recology at (650) 595-3900 for pricing and to schedule the pick-up.



ADDITIONAL FREE PROGRAMS

HOLIDAY TREES:

- Property Managers need to schedule tree collections with Recology on behalf of the entire complex.
- Holiday trees can be collected in centrally located piles, on-site compost containers, or in a debris box for no additional charge between Jan. 2 and Jan. 31.



USED HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES AND CELL PHONES:

Batteries and cell phones don't belong in any container!

- Recology has a Battery and Cell Phone Collection program for apartments and condos. Collection buckets can be placed in a common area such as a lobby, multi-use room, mail room, or clubhouse.
- Place used and unwanted batteries and cell phones in a clear, sealed zip-top bag before placing into the orange bucket.
- If your complex does not have an orange collection bucket, please contact your Property Manager to request a free bucket from Recology.



HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Collection services do not occur on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Alternate collection days will occur for customers affected by these two holidays. **Recology provides regular collection services on ALL other holidays.**

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Recology provides **FREE Shred** (Document Destruction) and **Compost Giveaway** events at participating Member Agencies each year. SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFERS A FREE HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAM

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as cleaners, pesticides, and propane tanks cannot be disposed of in any of your three carts or bins. San Mateo County's HHW Program helps residents responsibly dispose of their HHW for free. **Residents must schedule an appointment at smhealth.org/hhw or by calling (650) 363-4718.**

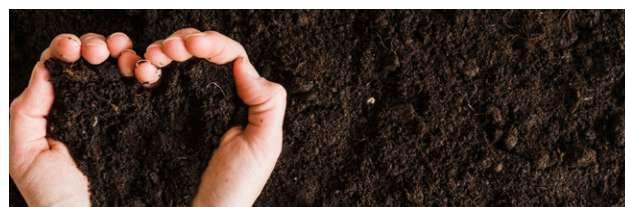
TRANSFER STATION:

Mon – Fri: 6 a.m. – 6 p.m. | Sat – Sun: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.
Closed on Thanksgiving, Christmas, & New Year's Day.

The Transfer Station accepts the following from residents and commercial vehicles and are subject to charge:

- Garbage & Organics
- Construction & Demolition debris
- Appliances
- Up to 5 mattresses or box springs can be dropped off by residents at no charge
- Discounted rates for clean green waste & lumber

Mon – Sat: 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. | Sun: Closed
Closed on Thanksgiving, Christmas, & New Year's Day.

The Public Recycling Center accepts the following items free of charge:

- Household batteries & cell phones
- Cooking oil
- Used motor oil, oil filters, & antifreeze
- Electronics & fluorescent lights
- Paint (latex & oil-based)
- Sharps/Needles (must be in sealed container)
