Quick Guides YARD WASTE & RECYCLING

YARD WASTE CART

✔ Put yard/landscape materials & untreated wood & wood chips

✘ **UNACCEPTABLE**
 Oleander, palm, pampas, ice plant & cactus. No bags, treated wood, or rocks/dirt.

RECYCLING CART

✔ Put recyclable items loose in the blue cart EXCEPT for shredded paper—place that in a paper bag labeled "shredded paper."

Disposal of TREATED WOOD WASTE

What is treated wood?

Treated wood is any wood that has been treated with a chemical preservative. These chemicals help protect the wood from insect attack and fungal decay while it's being used. Fence posts, landscape timbers, pilings, and decking, to name a few, are all examples of chemically treated wood. It is considered a hazardous waste in California.

How do I dispose of treated wood?

Under an approved variance, Recology Butte Colusa Counties **will accept** treated wood waste for disposal at our transfer station. It must be separated from non-treated wood, and a Treated Wood Waste log sheet must be filled out.

AB1826 & AB341 COMMERCIAL ORGANICS & RECYCLING LAWS

Effective since 2012, California Assembly Bill 341 requires businesses and organizations that dispose of four (4) or more cubic yards of commercial solid waste per week and multi-family dwellings with five (5) or more dwelling units and shared refuse service to recycle.

Updated **January 1, 2021**, California Assembly Bill 1826 requires businesses and organizations that **generate two (2) or more cubic yards of waste per week** to recycle organic waste. Organic wastes include food waste, food soiled paper, garden and landscape waste, and clean/untreated wood. Multi-family dwellings with five (5) or more units and shared refuse service are also subject to AB 1826, but are not required to recycle food waste, only yard waste and landscape materials generated at their properties.
