Hazardous wastes are unwanted household products that are labeled as flammable, toxic, corrosive, or reactive. These items are not permitted in your recycling, organics, or landfill bins and must be disposed of properly. Examples of HHW are:

- Antifreeze*
- Car and Household Batteries
- Cellular Phones
- Computers and Televisions
- Fluorescent Tubes and Bulbs
- Latex (Water-Based) Paint*
- Motor Oil* and Filters
- Small Household Appliances

Organics Kitchen Pails



If your complex subscribes to the composting program, we'll provide each tenant with a two-gallon kitchen pail for in-home use. Kitchen pails are a handy and convenient way to keep your kitchen neat and clean while collecting food scraps and other compostables. When the pail is filled, you simply toss it into the green organics cart or bin on the property.

Recycling Buddy Bags



Recycling Buddy Bags are available to residents of multi-family dwellings (apartment and condominium complexes with 5 or more units) free of charge. These sturdy, large-capacity bags can be placed in kitchens or any convenient location to hold all recyclables until residents are ready to empty them into the main recycle cart or bin on the property.

HOW TO USE YOUR KITCHEN PAIL



Use your kitchen pail to collect food scraps and transport them to your organics bin.



1. Line with newspaper, a paper towel, or paper bag.

Paper absorbs moisture which helps control odors and keeps the pail clean.



2. Empty every day or two into your organics bin.

Use your pail to transport uncoated soiled paper and food scraps to your organics bin.
