As many of you have seen at our open houses or by visiting the site, our beloved 73-year-old Barrett Community Center was built as a school and is now well beyond its useful life. Meanwhile, the Belmont community of today and tomorrow need a modern facility that meets current accessibility, earthquake, and fire safety standards.

We launched the Community Center Conversation last December, and through three open houses and three community presentations to date, neighbors have encouraged us to take action to modernize our center and explore leveraging developer contributions and grant

funding to maintain existing services, including spaces for sports for all ages, a safe children's play area, childcare, and new amenities such as multigenerational spaces and emergency resources.
